## Airports Economic Regulatory Authority of India

Why was it in the news?

- Recently, the Airports Economic Regulatory Authority of India (Amendment) Bill, 2019 was introduced in Rajya Sabha.
- It amends the Airports Economic Regulatory Authority of India Act, 2008. The Act established the Airports Economic Regulatory Authority of India (AERA).

## AERA is responsible for determining:

- (i)The tariff for aeronautical services at different airports every five years
- (ii) The development fees of major airports
- (iii) The passengers service fee.

It can also call for necessary information to determine tariffs and perform any other tariff-related functions, including amending the tariffs if necessary in the interim periods.

## **Key provisions**

- Definition of major airports→ annual traffic of more than 35 lakh passengers(currently, 15 lakh)
- AERA shall not determine: (i) the tariff, (ii) tariff structures, or (iii) the development fees, in certain cases. These cases include those where such tariff amounts were a part of the bid document on the basis of which the airport operations were awarded.
- AERA will be consulted by the concessioning authority before incorporating such tariffs in the bid document,

and such tariffs must be notified.
