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In news— Atal Tunnel has now been certified by the World Book
of Records, as the 'World's Longest Highway Tunnel' above
10,000 Feet.

About Atal Tunnel-

- It provides all-weather connectivity from Manali to the Lahaul - Spiti Valley.
- It was inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on 3 October 2020.
- The cost of the entire project is Rs. 3,200 crore.
- The 9.02 km long, strategically significant, Atal Tunnel, that runs under the 'Rohtang Pass' was constructed on the Manali Leh Highway under the challenging conditions of freezing temperatures in extremely difficult terrain.
- The tunnel reduces the travel time and overall distance between Manali and Keylong on the way to Leh by 46 km.
- It is built with ultra-modern specifications in the Pir Panjal range of Himalayas at an altitude of 3000 mtr (10,000 feet) from the Mean Sea Level (MSL).
- Shape (cross-section) of Tunnel: Horseshoe
- It is 10.5-metre wide and has a 3.6 x 2.25 mtr fire proof emergency egress tunnel built into the main tunnel itself.
- The tunnel was built using the New Austrian tunnelling method and has been equipped with a semi-transverse ventilation system, where large fans separately circulate air throughout the tunnel.
