Dispute resolution mechanism for wind/solar sector approved

The Ministry of New and Renewable Energy approved the setting up of a dispute resolution mechanism for disputes between solar/ wind power developers, and the **Solar Energy Corporation** of India (SECI)

Key highlights

- Under the mechanism, a three member Dispute Resolution Committee will be set up. The Committee members will be eminent persons located in the NCR of Delhi.
- This mechanism will be applicable for all solar/ wind schemes and projects being implemented by the SECI/NTPC.
- The Committee will consider the following type of cases:
- All cases of appeals against decisions given by SECI on extension of time requests based on the terms of contract, and
- 2. All requests for extension not covered under the terms of contract.
 - The recommendations of the Committee and the Ministry's observations will be placed before the Minister for New and Renewable Energy for final decision.
