Exercise Cobra Warrior

<u>In news</u>— Indian Air Force to participate in a multi nation air exercise named 'Ex Cobra Warrior 22' at Waddington, UK from 06 to 27 March 2022.

About the exercise-

- It is aimed at providing operational exposure and sharing best practices amongst the participating Air Forces, thereby enhancing combat capability and forging bonds of friendship.
- From India, IAF Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Tejas will participate in the exercise along with fighter aircraft of UK and other leading Air Forces.
- Once participated, it would be the maiden deployment for LCA Tejas in an international exercise for the indigenous fighter.
- However, the U.K. is planning to cancel the exercise in view of the Russian invasion and offensive in Ukraine.
- This year, U.K. was to host India for the bilateral air exercise Indradhanush, and instead had asked the IAF to join the multi-nation exercise Cobra Warrior.
- The exercise was also to see the participation of Air Forces of Belgium, Saudi Arabia, Sweden and the U.S.

About Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Tejas-

- It is the smallest and lightest Multi-Role Supersonic Fighter Aircraft of its class.
- It is India's first self-made fighter jet.
- In February 2019, it received the final operational clearance as a fully-weaponized fighter jet for induction into the Indian Air Force.
- Designed by the Aeronautical Development Agency (ADA), the indigenously-developed aircraft has been manufactured at the Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) for the Indian Air Force and the Indian Navy.

 Tejas aircraft can carry the same array of modern weapons that can be loaded on bigger warplanes, for example – precision-guided and standoff weaponry to long-range beyond visual range missiles that can take down target planes from a safe distance.
