In news- A team of Delhi University (DU) researchers has
discovered a new frog species and has named it after former DU
Vice-Chancellor and plant geneticist Deepak Pental.

More information-

- The new frog species, Minervarya Pentali, was **discovered from the Western Ghats biodiversity hotspo**t at multiple localities in Kerala and Tamil Nadu.
- This new species is endemic to the southern Western Ghats.
- This species is also among the smallest known Minervarya frogs.
- It belongs to the family Dicroglossidae.
- The new species was identified on the basis of multiple criteria including "external morphology, DNA and calling pattern."
- The study was funded by DU, Department of Science and Technology (DoST), CSIR, Critical Ecosystem partnership Fund from the US, and Global Wildlife Conservation in the US.

Minervarya sahyadris is a species of frog that is also endemic to Western Ghats of India. Its IUCN status is *Endangered*.
