About the HMIS of Indian Railways

- The HMIS of Indian Railways has been developed by Indian Railways in coordination with RailTel Corporation Limited.
- The objective of the HMIS is to provide a single-window of clearance of hospital administration activity such as clinical, diagnostics, pharmacy, examinations, industrial health, etc.
- The primary objectives of the envisaged solution are:
 - Effectively manage all the health facilities & their resources
 - Monitor performance of hospitals across the administrative channel
 - Impart quality health care services to its beneficiaries
 - Improve the patient turn-around time
 - Generate and maintain EMR (electronic medical records) of all patients

What is a Management Information System?

- It is an information system used for decision-making, and for the coordination, control, analysis, and visualization of information in an organization.
- MIS is a people-oriented field with an emphasis on service through technology
- The study of the management information systems involves

people, processes and technology in an organizational context

- In a corporate setting, the ultimate goal of the use of a management information system is to increase the value and profits of the business
- This is done by providing managers with timely and appropriate information allowing them to make effective decisions within a shorter period of time.

Five eras of MIS

- First Era – Mainframe and minicomputer computing
- Second Era – Personal computers
- Third Era – Client/server networks
- Fourth Era – Enterprise computing
- Fifth Era – Cloud computing
